
In Order to Receive We Must Give: the Eleventh Step Prayer

Tradition Eleven: Our public relations policy is based on attraction rather than promotion; we need always maintain personal anonymity at the level of press, radio, and film.

Facts about anonymity in A.A.

- A.A. members may disclose their identity and speak as recovered alcoholics, giving radio, TV and Internet interviews, without violating the Traditions — so long as their A.A. membership is not revealed.
- A.A. members may speak as A.A. members only if their names or faces are not revealed. They speak not for A.A., but as individual members.
- Experience suggests that A.A. members . . . Use last names within the Fellowship, especially for election of group officers and other service jobs.

The Twelve Concepts: Concept Eleven

"While the trustees hold final responsibility for A.A.'s world service administration, they should always have the assistance of the best possible standing committees, corporate service directors, executives, staffs, and consultants. Therefore, the composition of these underlying committees and service boards, the personal qualifications of their members, the manner of their induction into service, the systems of their rotation, the way in which they are related to each other, the special rights and duties of our executives, staffs, and consultants, together with a proper basis for the financial compensation of these special workers, will always be matters for serious care and concern."

Concept Eleven is a "nuts and bolts" concept about the way we organize and run the General Service Office in New York, the A.A. Grapevine office, and A.A. World Services (publisher of all A.A.'s literature). It offers principles and suggestions in four areas of our service activities. An excellent summary is available in the pamphlet, *The Twelve Concepts for World Service, Illustrated*. Although the Concepts pertain directly to our General Service organizations, they also provide the basis for the G.S.O. guidelines for Intergroups and Central Offices.

- 1. The status of executives
- 2. Paid workers, how compensated
- 3. Rotation among paid staff workers
- 4. Full "participation" of paid workers is highly important


Dear Bill W.,




Is your meeting represented at Intergroup?


